Referring generally to students with intellectual disability.	Students with intellectual disability.	Mathematics resources designed for students with intellectual disability are available in the staff shared drive.
Referring generally to students with learning disability.	Diverse learners.	Mathematics resources designed for diverse learners are available in the staff shared drive.
Referring generally to students with disability related to vision.	Students who are blind or low vision.	Our staff ensure all communication and learning material is provided in an accessible format for students who are blind or low vision.
Referring generally to students with disability related to hearing.	Deaf and hard of hearing students.	Our staff ensure all communication and learning material is provided in an accessible format for Deaf and hard of hearing students.
